Mary Beth Larsen, DC is an individual who has proved that nothing is impossible. She has climbed mountains (most recently Mt. Kilimanjaro, the tallest mountain in Africa with an elevation of 19,340 feet), graduated with a doctor of chiropractic degree, won a gold medal at the Pan American Games and participated twice in the Olympics. She broke the glass ceiling in 2000 when she became the first woman to qualify for the Pentathlon, a multi-sport event which includes pistol shooting, fencing, equestrian jumping, running and swimming.
